Gadiel Statement at presentation of the film "Border" NYC June 28, 2007

A few days ago at press conference Pres. Bush finally said something truthful. Talking about the Bush-Kennedy Comprehensive Amnesty Bill he said:

QUOTE:

"You know, I've heard all the rhetoric – you've heard it, too – about how this is amnesty. Amnesty means that you've got to pay a price for having been here illegally, and this bill does that."

So for once the President was not lying.

In a way, this was a disappointment to me.

Since 1993, throughout the entire Clinton-Bush Administration, and in terms of not securing our borders and exposing us to terrorism and crime by aliens, they are one administration.
