The 9/11 FSA Foundation today denounced the grossly inflated salaries of officials of the National September 11 Memorial and Museum. The Foundation, representing families of the victims of the 9/11 attacks, issued the following statement:

We are disgusted that 9/11 Memorial Director Joseph Daniels and Museum Director Alice Greenwald are being paid annual salaries of \$351,000 and \$337,000 respectively, and that many other officers are being paid between \$170,000 and \$337,000 per year.

Clearly, Daniels and Greenwald see the Memorial not as a means to honor the victims of 9/11 but rather as a means to enrich themselves.

On the same day that the NY Post published news of these inflated salaries Sen. Charles Schumer and Rep. Jerrold Nadler issued a press release denouncing a private "mint" peddling "10th anniversary 9/11 coins." The 911 FSA Foundation applauds the Schumer/Nadler statement that "no one should be profiting off 9/11."

The 911FSA Foundation also is in full agreement with Schumer's statement that "National Collector's Mint has no shame...this company is preying on the memories of that tragic day, generating millions in profits, and diverting potential funds to finance the 9/11 Memorial at Ground Zero."

The 9/11 FSA Foundation also agrees with Schumer's demands that the Federal Trade Commission "crackdown on this unscrupulous company and send a loud message that profiteering off a national tragedy will not be tolerated."

However, Sen. Schumer's failure to demand an investigation into the inflated salaried of 911 Memorial officers is a clear demonstration of his tolerance for *government sanctioned* "profiting off a national tragedy."
