9/11 Families for a Secure America (9/11FSA) today applauded the decision by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) to release the names of all convicted criminal illegal aliens apprehended in Prince William County, Va.

9/11 FSA Vice-President Bruce DeCell notes that ICE's decision came only because of persistent demands by Corey Stewart, Chairman of the County Commission. Mr. Stewart has brought tremendous reductions in violent crimes in his county by turning over to ICE illegals arrested by police under his jurisdiction and has proven that enforcement of immigration law saves American lives. That's why he has demanded that ICE turn over this information."

9/11 FSA Board member Ed Kowalski, himself the uncle of rape/murder victim, 17 year old Elizabeth Butler commented: "It's a good start for ICE to disclose the criminal illegals in Prince William County, but there are 3,139 other counties in the U.S. Why are many the supervisors, mayors and managers of those counties not demanding the same information? Don't the people of those counties have a right to the same protection?

DeCell added: "There is no excuse for ICE releasing a single illegal alien convicted of a crime back into the U.S. Of course, every illegal should be deported, but for the federal government to release illegal alien convicts is a major scandal."

9/11 FSA is the primary voice in the United States for victims of violent crimes committed by illegal aliens.
