The 9/11 FSA Foundation today challenged Joy Behar and the other members of the panel of "The View" to travel to the Arizona border and spend a week living near the routes used by illegal aliens and drug smugglers to sneak into the United States.

9/11 FSA board member \_\_\_\_\_ said: "We invite Behar to find out what our friends who live in southern Arizona already know, that their lives are in danger every day. Those of us who have been the victims of crimes committed by illegals think Behar and the rest of 'The View' crew should leave their luxury Manhattan apartments and speak to those who have seen their family members murdered by illegals.

Ed Kowalski, whose 17 year old niece, Elizabeth Butler was murdered in Putnam County in 2005 by an illegal who stalked, raped and murdered her, said: "It's easy for wealthy, pampered women living in the cocoon of safety their wealth buys them to criticize those who have lost loved ones or those who are living their daily lives in fear from human smuggling rings controlled by drug cartels."

\_\_\_\_\_ said: Too many wealthy people, who so often hire illegals because they are cheap labor, look down their noses at the average Americans whose lives or jobs are endangered or lost. It's time for people like Behar to climb down from her gilded existence and walk a mile in the shoes of Americans living in fear along the border.

Peter Gadiel, president of 9/11 FSA challenged Behar live alone in a house near the smuggling routes. He said: "The weather in Arizona is beautiful in the fall, and I'm sure Ms. Behar will enjoy late night walks in the desert. She can get a sense of what it is like to be vulnerable to criminals who violate our laws the moment they cross our border. If she comes back unscathed, maybe she'll show a little more sympathy for those who oppose illegal immigration.
