His son, James, worked for Cantor-Fitzgerald as an assistant trader on the 103rd floor of the WTC North Tower. He was murdered in the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. He was 23 years old and had started to work for Cantor in March 2001.

He is a founder and president of 9/11 Families for a Secure America, a group comprised of family members of those who died in the mass murders of September 11. Since 9/11 Gadiel has devoted full time to educating the public, the Congress, and state legislatures on the obvious: the need to prevent illegal aliens and the unknown terrorists among them from entering into or remaining in the United States. His testimony on this issue is part of the 9/11 Commission record. He has appeared on numerous television and radio programs speaking on the need for secure borders.
